GOLF COURSE POLICIES

All golfers are required to:

- Replace divots and repair ball marks;
- Avoid trampling the fescue or causing damage to the course;
- Remain outside of environmentally sensitive areas;
- Follow all posted directions; and
- Avoid placing alcoholic beverages and cigars/cigarettes on any playing surface.

1. Pace of Play - All players are expected to maintain an acceptable pace of play on the course. We do ask that foursomes play in 4 hours and 15 minutes. Members are responsible for their guests' pace of play. A group taking longer will be subject to action by our professional golf staff. Please walk briskly between shots, be ready to play when it is your turn to play and execute shots promptly. Keep pace with the group in front of you and be aware of players behind you at all times. Players are encouraged to "hit when ready" as long as other players are not endangered.

Out of courtesy to other golfers any group taking a prolonged break for refreshments at the halfway house or clubhouse will lose their place on the course and may resume play at a time that will not impede the group directly behind them.

2. Adherence To Cart Signs - Please follow all cart signage. They are in place to protect the course as well as players from areas that are not suitable for carts.

3. Lightning Safety - The Thorguard Lightning Detection System is designed to give players a warning eight to 20 minutes in advance of a potential strike in the area so that you may find appropriate shelter. At the sound of the warning sirens, which will be one long horn sound, all play must cease. Players and caddies must head back to the clubhouse or seek shelter in the grounds maintenance building. The system will sound an "all clear" siren - three consecutive horn sounds, when it is safe to return to the golf course. Players are not permitted to play until this all clear is heard and the golf staff has given the ok to resume play.

4. Bug Spray - All aerosols used for insect repellent should be applied away from grassed areas and *never* on a playing surface.

5. Golf Course Dress Code - Proper golf attire is required at all times.

Men – Slacks or full-length shorts (no more than three to four inches above the knee and without cargo pockets). Collared shirts must be worn and tucked in at all times.

Women – Pants or Bermuda length (no more than three to four inches above the knee), conventional blouses and tee shirts.

All Players – Clothing with offensive language or designs, blue jeans, short shorts, tennis shorts, bathing suits, tank tops and halter tops are not considered suitable.

CLUBHOUSE POLICIES

In an effort to assist everyone with their golf experience our professional staff has highlighted a few traditions of the Club that we ask all guests to abide by.

1. Clubhouse Dress Code Policy - Colored denim, tank tops, T-shirts, cargo pants, and rubber flip flops are not permitted in the dining rooms, porches, private dining rooms or bar area at any time.

2. Evening Dress Code - Golf, Bermuda or dress shorts will be allowed in the bar and porch area in the evening. Collared shirts are required for gentlemen at all times. Ladies are requested to dress in a fashion compatible with the dress required of gentlemen. Shorts and dresses should be an appropriate length. Jackets are required only for evening social events specifically designated by the House Committee or Golf Committee. Customary golf attire is allowed throughout the day in all dining areas.

We do ask for your cooperation on this so that everyone can have an enjoyable dining experience.

3. Hats / Visors - Hats are to be worn forward at all times. Gentlemen are to remove hats in the clubhouse. Hats/visors (gentlemen) are not permitted in the dining rooms.

4. Tipping - Tipping is not permitted at the Club.

5. Cell Phone/Handheld Device Policy - Guests are permitted to use their cell phone or hand held device for text or email use while in the clubhouse and locker rooms. Should a guest wish to take or make a call they must use one of the private rooms (card room, living room, Founders Room on the second floor), if available. Out of respect to other members and guests using the clubhouse, the doors should be closed during the duration of the call. All ringers must be kept on vibrate or silent at all times. Cell phone/hand held device use is not permitted on the golf course except for determining yardage.

6. Smoking - Smoking is only permitted only in designated areas.

7. Cash and Credit Cards – All food, beverages, cottages and other goods and services shall be paid by signed receipt of the member. Guests may use credit cards and cash for golf shop purchases.
